Society for Military History Firsts

March 16, 1933- Major C.C. Benson drafts the first position paper calling for a non-profit military history organization to aid the U.S. Army

June 2, 1933 After a series of informal discussions amongst military and civilian archival personnel, papers are filed in Washington, D.C formally incorporating the American Military History Foundation (AMHF)

June 9, 1933 The first official meeting of AMHF is held

Jan-February, 1935 The first in a series of three articles by members on the study of military history were published in *Army Ordnance* (through the assistance of managing editor Colonel Leo A. Codd)

April 1, 1937 The organization publishes the first issue of the *Journal of the AMHF* with art and ink illustrations provided by member Fred Todd

November 1938 A formal discussion begins to change the name of the organization

December 28, 1938 At the membership meeting of the AMHF in Chicago, the members vote for the renaming of the organization as the American Military Institute. At the meeting, a name change for the journal was also approved, but the name change occurs two years later

June 2, 1938 Although some in the organization began using AMI starting in January, AMHF was only legally incorporated as AMI in June. A second filing for incorporation under the name AMI was made on March 24, 1939, changing part of the description and address of the organization

January/Spring 1940 *The Journal of the AMHF* is first published under a new name *The Journal of the American Military Institute* (Volume 4, Number 1)

Spring 1941 *The Journal of the American Military Institute* is first published under the name of *Military Affairs* (Volume 5, Number 1)

January/Spring 1989 *Military Affairs* is first published under the name *The Journal of Military History* (Volume 53, Number 1)

July 1990 After several informal discussions, the council considers a proposed name change for the organization from AMI to the Society for Military History (SMH). Records indicate the name change was approved by a nearly unanimous vote

March 10, 1991 The proposed name change of AMI to SMH is put to the general membership

June 11, 1991 The Certificate of Amendment is formally signed by a notary with Richard Kohn (president) and B.F. Cooling (secretary) certifying the name change from AMI to SMH in the records of incorporation in the District of Columbia

January 9, 1999 Russell Weigley gives the inaugural Marshall Lecture on "What Military Historians Can Teach Other Historians" at the American Historical Association annual meeting
